"Since the 16th century, the Church established special devotions to each month of the year to help the faithful grow in a more profound union with God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—through the Sacraments, the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Joseph and all the saints. The specific devotion during the month of February is to the Holy Family.

At the Annunciation, upon the fiat of the Blessed Virgin Mary, "Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it done to me according to thy word," (Lk 1, 38) the Holy Spirit overshadowed her and the Word of God incarnated in her womb. Accordingly, as Mary had already been espoused to Saint Joseph (cf. Lk 1, 27), we behold the institution of the Holy Family. God the Son came into the world through a family. That signifies for us the importance of the family.

The family is the "domestic church" (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church, nos. 1655-1658). Through the family, we first learn about God. It is where we first begin a relationship with God. The family is the first place in which we learn to live in God and to act in a holy way with one another. Fittingly, family life is a fundamental expression of our salvation.

The Holy Family, therefore, is, in the culmination of God's plan of salvation, the highest example to whom all families ought to look in the perfection of every domestic virtue. "
