Pastoral and Finance Councils

"How can we make this big parish feel small?" Over 4,300 people - part of over 1400 families belong to Resurrection Parish. Our Mission is to grow in our own faith, deepen our roots in our faith, and deepen the relationship that each one of us has with Christ and with each other in Christ. As well, we want to reach beyond the walls of our church and our current parishioners, into our community, to share and spread God's love, joy and Word to our neighbors and community.

Pastoral Council

<u>Vice Chair</u> is responsible to assist the Pastoral Chair with pastoral council duties and temporarily assume these duties when the Chair is absent. This includes keeping parishioners informed and developing and maintaining good relations between parishioners and the parish organizations, and other parishes and the public.

Ecumenism is responsible for the education of the Parish on ecumenical issues. This committee shall act as a liaison with other Christian churches and other faith groups in the area and in the development of inter-church activities. Help coordinate and promote Praise in the Park, World Day of Prayer.

Stewardship is responsible for creating awareness in all parishioners that everything we have comes from God: our life, our talents, our abilities, our intellectual gifts, our resources, and our holiness. There is only one chair who serves on both Pastoral and Finance Councils.

Hospitality is responsible coordinating social events throughout the year such as coffee Sunday's, Bingo, Halloween party etc.

Finance Council Vice Chair assists the Finance Chair with leading the advisory body responsible for safeguarding the finances and assets of Resurrection Parish and ensuring financial data is communicated to pastor, pastoral council and sub-committees and all other affected parties. A business background, especially financial and accountings skills, is valuable.
