Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Imagine a world in which our interior lives are in complete harmony with the world around us and our deepest desire matches exactly what our Creator God has in mind for us, thus answering our deepest inner longing. Among the first things to realize is that within each one of us there is a longing that runs more deeply than anything we can easily articulate, let alone attain.

The Gospel message is one that invites entry into an ever-deeper love, a love that takes us to the very source of life itself and to the Truth about life. The Gospel message is one that promises fulfilment of that longing but is not a message always easily grasped, received or accepted.

Human history, as well as our own personal history have shown over and over again how our efforts to attain fulfilment on our own (that is without the Gospel) fall short every time. Even if for a time these efforts appear to satisfy, they soon reveal themselves to be empty of fruit that sustains. Sometimes we must go through some pretty rough times before we realize this.

Because of life's uncertainty, and because of our hunger for fulfilment, it is very easy to be misled in the search for fulfilment. The truth about life and love which Jesus of Nazareth lived and taught is easily overlooked in favour of world views that are more immediate and accessible.

In our Palm Sunday Liturgy which began our Holy Week, we saw how quickly and immediately the crowds jumped in and hailed Jesus as he entered Jerusalem and then, how quickly things went sideways and people were calling for Him to be crucified. The mob mentality is alive and well in this world. In our fallen nature, we are a fickle and impulsive lot. We can fall victim to peer pressure and respond accordingly. If only we could come to recognize the need for patience, prayer and thinking things through before speaking or acting.

Pope Francis in His letter Lenten Message of 2024, 'Through the Desert, God Leads us to Freedom', reminds us we are being called to ultimate freedom, freedom from spiritual slavery to sin. He says, 'the call to freedom is a demanding one. It is not answered straight away; it has to mature as part of a journey. Just as Israel in the desert still clung to Egypt – often longing for the past and grumbling against the Lord and Moses – today too, God's people can cling to an oppressive bondage that it is called to leave behind.' We see Lent as a time where, 'God shapes His people, He enables us to leave our slavery behind. (Hosea 2:16-17). That involves leaving behind our need for immediate answers and immediate satisfaction. We can ask ourselves if we have made strides in this area over Lent.

Pope Francis in the same Lenten letter reminds us, 'In the presence of God, we become brothers and sisters, more sensitive to one another: In place of threats and enemies, we discover companions and fellow travellers. This is God's dream, the promised land to which we journey once we have left our slavery behind.

This weekend we celebrate Easter, the Pascal Mystery, the Death and Resurrection of Jesus, Son of God, from the dead. The love of God is gradually being revealed and is intended to be experienced by all of humanity. We see this reality unfolding throughout salvation history as portrayed in the Old Testament, culminating in the birth of the Saviour into the world, and followed by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. We encapsulate the telling of that story at the Easter Vigil.

May this Easter season be a time of deepening our recognition that we are children of God, and that our sins do not define us. We are being revealed as a new creation in Christ. May we continue learning to leave behind us all that leads us to sin and embrace in faith and with great love our ongoing journey toward true inner peace and true fellowship with those around us.





Warm Welcome Coalition



Support Needed for Warm Welcome Centre

Local faith communities, organizations and concerned citizens have come together, recognizing the crisis for the houseless community and the severe cold weather coming. The Warm Welcome Coalition celebrates the funding announced to Carmichael Outreach from the Saskatchewan Government and the City of Regina for an overnight warming centre in Regina. Carmichael Outreach has offered their space and has developed a budget for staffing and managing this project. The centre will be open from 11pm to 7am, 7 days a week, from January to May 2024. The Warm Welcome Centre expects to provide space for up to 60 people at the start. We see this as addressing an immediate need while we continue to press the governments for a more permanent solution to houselessness, i.e. affordable housing with wraparound supports (Housing First).

We are now looking for volunteers to support the Carmichael staff overnight and various donors (faith communities and individuals) to donate food and beverages.

Volunteers should contact Carmichael Outreach's volunteer coordinator at https://carmichaeloutreach.ca/volunteer/. All volunteers must have a current police records check. Volunteers will also be asked to attend an orientation.

Donors will be primarily from faith communities. Donations could include items such as coffee/tea and supplies, juice, and snacks (e.g. muffins, sandwiches, baking, fruit, etc.) with enough for 60 people. Donations will be received during the daytime hours. No deliveries can be accepted at night for security reasons.




